ELIGIBILITY FOR HEALTH SERVICES

Most international students are not entitled to publicly funded health services while in New Zealand. If you receive medical treatment during your visit you may be liable for the full costs of that treatment. ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The Accident Compensation Corporation provides accident insurance for all New Zealand citizens, residents and temporary visitors to New Zealand, but you may still be liable for all other medical and related costs. Further information can be viewed on the ACC website at www.acc.co.nz

HEALTH AND TRAVEL INSURANCE

International students must have appropriate and current health and travel insurance while studying in New Zealand. The College can provide you with information on insurance companies that specialise in such policies.

A deposit of \$200.00 is normally required upon enrolment. This amount is deducted from your total fees payable. Student Fee Protection Insurance of \$25 per course is also payable at the time of enrolment.

A 10% discount applies for enrolment on two consecutive courses provided the enrolments take place at the same time, and where no subsequent cancellation takes place. The discount applies to the second course. (For example, a domestic student enrolment on the Certificate in Travel & Tourism and the Certificate in International Travel, Tourism & IT (48 weeks of study) will cost only \$7758 instead of \$8140.

Fees quoted are inclusive of training materials, workbooks and resources required for your course, but do not include assessment resit fees or personal stationery. Additional costs are listed here:

- + Recommended textbooks for the Diploma in Tourism & Travel Management are not included in course fees.
- + Some costs associated with course field trips are met by the student, and estimated at no more than \$250 per course.
- + IATA/UFTAA cross credit fees on the Certificate in International Travel, Tourism & IT is an additional cost, currently \$295 per student.
- + Student Fee Protection Insurance is \$25 per course.
